

# Health Savings Account Hardship Policy/ April 1, 2010

The Brown County Board of Commissioners as Plan Sponsors of the County's health insurance coverage program has adopted the following policy & procedure to accommodate employees who have health insurance coverage provided by the county.

The intent of this policy is to provide assistance to those employees who have immediate need for financial help with prescription and or medical bills. Whereas the county typically contributes the county's portion of the Health Savings Account money to the employee on a monthly basis, the Board of Commissioners realize that there may need to be exceptions to that procedure. The Board of Commissioners may agree to advance up to the full amount of the county's portion of the Health Savings Account monies to an employee's Health Savings Account in an accelerated manner. This would be subject to a decision by the Board of Commissioners on a case by case basis, and subject to the recommendation to the Board of Commissioners by the employee's appointing authority to accelerate advancing the standard amount of contribution to that employee's Health Savings Account. Note, this may also include any 'matching' contributions that may be available to the employee. The Board of Commissioners will require a written letter from the employee requesting assistance stating their specific need for requesting that some or all of the County's portion of the Health Savings Account monies be advanced into their Health Savings Account. The Board of Commissioners will also require the employee and their appointing authority to meet with the Board of Commissioners to discuss the hardship. The Board of Commissioners will deliberate and make a decision at their next regularly scheduled meeting regarding the request. If approved by a majority vote of the board, the Board of Commissioners will request the Brown County Auditor to transfer the specified amount of monies to the employee's Health Savings Account as soon as possible.
