WHEREAS, Public Law 90-284, 90<sup>th</sup> Congress under House Rule 2516, April 11, 1968, an act be enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled Title VII of the 1968 Civil Rights Act. Fair Housing and Title VII as amended by Section 808 (b) (1), (2), and (3) of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 Public Law 93-383, 93<sup>rd</sup> Congress, August 22, 1974.
